Commerce Science and Technology Fellowship (ComSci)

Administered by the Council in Government

Objective:	The purpose of the ComSci Program is to provide a hands-on learning experience for participants, increasing their understanding of: technological innovation as a source of national and international economic growth; the relationship of science and technology to government policies on economics, trade, education, and fiscal matters; the organization of scientific and technological activities in the Federal Government; and the technical activities and problems in other executive, legislative, and judicial agencies of the government, thereby motivating and encouraging the development of cooperative endeavors and programs.
Eligibility:	To be considered eligible for the ComSci Program, applicants must be career Federal Government employees of the Executive Branch; must be U.S. citizens; must have completed their undergraduate education; must be a level GS-13, GS-14, or GS-15 (or equivalent) in a professional or management series or SES; and must be nominated by their agency for consideration by the program.
Program Overview:	<p>Two ComSci options are offered to applicants:</p> <p>1. The ComSci Program With Work Assignment (Full-time Program)</p> <p>This option offers a 10-month, intensive and challenging work assignment in an executive or legislative branch office (generally in the Washington Metropolitan Area), coupled with the policy study and leadership program of weekly-scheduled ComSci seminars, site visits, and other activities.</p> <p>2. ComSci Program Without Work Assignment (Part-time Program)</p> <p>This option offers a 10-month policy study and leadership program without the work assignment. This option allows individuals to participate in ComSci on a once-a-week, part-time basis. Participants continue to work at their home agencies throughout the duration of the program while attending weekly and specially scheduled ComSci events. Option 2 is best suited for individuals in the Washington Metropolitan Area or for individuals who are able to commute to Washington, D.C., for one day each week.</p> <p>For full-time or part-time participants, the ComSci Program combines intensive education and orientation activities. The ComSci Fellows experience a broadening of knowledge and understanding not achievable through traditional fellowship programs. In turn, the ComSci Program develops, within the personnel of the federal service, the skills, and resources needed to conceive, plan, and effectively and intelligently implement national programs dealing with complex scientific and technological issues.</p>
Components:	Through weekly seminars, site visits, and a policy study trip, Fellows delve deeply into the “how’s, why’s, and where’s” behind decision-making, increasing their knowledge and understanding of science and technology policy-making and management. In addition to the structured study provided by the seminars, Fellows typically spend 10-months on a policy-related assignment in another Federal agency or on Capitol Hill.

Continued Service	Successful applicants must sign a Continued Service Agreement in order to participate in this program. The form is available on the ETS web site,

Nomination Procedure:	<p>DOE: a designated agency representative nominates Applicants for consideration for the ComSci Program. In general, nominations are based on the candidate's qualifications, accomplishments, and potential for career growth. Nomination by an agency does not ensure a candidate's selection by the ComSci Program.</p> <p>*The signature of the nominating official denotes agreement to support the applicant's salary, fringe benefits, housing or relocation expenses required, and local travel expenses.</p> <p>Step 1: For those organizations currently using the Corporate Human Resource Information System (CHRIS) training workflow, please use workflow to submit your request for training enrollment in Course #001563, Session 0003. For those organizations not currently using the training workflow process, please follow your existing interoffice registration process.</p> <p>Step 2: When the training request is approved, complete a nomination package; it must include complete Nomination form, application, and supporting documentation.
